

Temporary Dress Code

Hair: All hair must be secured off the face and neck under a baseball cap or bandana. No cowboy hats or knit/crocheted hats. No wisps of hair are to be in front of the securing headwear. If ponytail or braid in back is long enough to touch shoulders, the ponytail or braid must be coiled up and further secured behind the head.

Facial Hair: If you have facial hair, it should be neatly trimmed and less than an inch. If it protrudes further than this, you should restrain it with a beard net.

Nails: Must be trimmed and natural. No polish, no wraps, and no gel or acrylic nails.

Jewelry: One plain band may be worn on the hand. No watches or bracelets. No earrings.

Shirts/Jacket

*You may wear any chef jacket that you currently own until your Escoffier jacket is sent to you after the two week conditional enrollment period.

Shirts:

Sleeves: Shirts must have a minimum of a short sleeve. Long sleeves must not extend past the wrist. Sleeveless shirts, tanks, or tube tops are not permitted. Any color is fine.

Design: Shirt design must be plain. No printed graphics or brand logos are permitted. No offensive images. Stripes or plaid patterns are permitted, so long as they do not include brand logos or printed graphics.

Fabric: Shirt must be cotton or cotton blend. No wool/knit sweaters (cotton blend sweaters are fine). No hoodies.

Length: Shirt must cover the entire midsection when raising arms above head. No exposed midriffs.

Neckline: For shirts without a collar, a round neckline is acceptable. No low-cut or V-neck shirts are permitted.

Decorative flair: Shirts must not have any decorative flair that could pose a safety risk - such as, but not limited to, glitter, sequins, tassels, and other sewn-on details.

Pants:

Pants should be plain design pants, such as jeans, or work pants, such as Dickies.

Shoes:

Shoes must be closed-toe. No bare feet or exposed toes.
